As I enter my 2nd quarter as your commander, I want to thank everyone for the support and encouragement provided me.
I would also remind everyone that 2016 membership renewals are

available now.

Renew your 2016 Legion membership before Dec. 31, 2015, and you'll save the post from paying the \$5 increase in 2016 dues

The annual dues for each Legion post are listed in what is known as the Blue Book. This book is updated and printed each July. The Blue Book lists our dues as \$35 per year. Our dues cannot be increased until the updated Blue Book is printed in July 2016, and only if approved by post membership. As a result, for each member who pays his or her 2016 dues between Jan. I and June 30, 2016, we are forced to take the \$5 dues increase from the portion allotted to the post.

What does this mean? Today, if a member pays her \$35 dues for 2016 prior to Dec. 31, 2015, we keep \$9 of the dues payment and forward the remaining \$26 to Department. Should that member pay her \$35 dues for 2016 between Jan. 1 and June 30, 2016, we must now forward \$31 to Department. The extra \$5 must come from the post's allotted \$9.

In simple language, each member that renews his or her 2016 membership between Jan. I and June 30, 2016 will cost the post \$5. Please help your post by renewing your 2016 Legion dues before Dec. 31, 2015.

Beginning Jan. I, it appears that 2016 Legion dues will be raised \$5. In their press release, the National Executive Committee (NEC) states, "With more than 3 million veterans of the global war on terrorism restarting civilian lives, or soon to do so, and looking to The American Legion for help, the NEC passed a resolution at the 2015 Spring Meetings in Indianapolis to recommend a \$5 per capita annual increase in national membership dues. High-pressure misting systems are in use at a number of local pubs and restaurants with great success. A high-pressure system designed for our patio would run about \$1,850, given this year's prices. I'm confident that we could find support from the other post families in helping to raise the required funds.

I would remind members of the need to lock the kitchen fridge, walk-in cooler, freezer, and pantry when not in use. It's a pain to unlock/lock every time but a number of food items have disappeared. Every item in the post was bought and paid for by its members. Losses to theft reduce the funds available to support our veterans, our youth programs and our community. Be aware of suspicious activities near food or alcohol storage areas during off-hours. We are a family and

any family member experiencing temporary financial hardship may receive assistance from the post if needed.

Kitchen volunteers should be aware that our dull knives have been sharpened thanks to the efforts of **Larry Cox**. Be extra careful when reaching into the knife drawer or you'll cut yourself. Thanks also to **Dennis Brisbon** for cleaning the ice machine and in helping to rewire the walk-in cooler.

Our memorial service on Aug. 29 for **Tom Campbell** was greatly appreciated by Tom's family. Once again, Legion Chaplain **Ed Kownslar** conducted a memorable service. Several Legionnaires shared their memories of Tom and of his not-so-subtle humor. Following the memorial service, a bit of Tom's ashes were added to the front cactus garden.

3rd Annual Homeless Veterans Benefit

On Sept.12, the American Legion Riders of Love Field Post 453 will host the 3rd Annual Homeless Veterans Benefit Run. All funds raised will be donated to the Homeless Veterans Services of Dallas (HVSD) for use in providing emergency housing, food, clothing, job training and child care for in-need veterans and their families.

Since its inception in 2013, our benefit runs have generated over \$350,000 in donations of money, clothing, food, and personal care items to the HVSD. Officially, there are about 1,500 homeless veterans, and about 70 dependent children, living in the Dallas area. It is estimated that the actual number of homeless veterans living in the Dallas area is closer to 2.000.

Our 3rd Annual Homeless Veterans Benefit Run includes a motorcycle poker run with stops at local watering holes where participants may enjoy a beverage while enjoying the company of other motorcycle enthusiasts.

The poker run will end at Post 453 at about 2 PM where a num-

ber of activities are planned to complete the day's fundraising.

There will be a cake walk and a washer tournament followed by a sumptuous barbecue for a donation of \$10. A 50/50 drawing and a raffle for a beautiful, hand-made quilt are also scheduled for the afternoon.

Every participant in the poker run and everyone making a \$10 donation for the barbecue meal will be entered in a drawing for one of our many fine door prizes. All proceeds to be donated to the Homeless Veterans Services of Dallas.

Our donations to the HVSD allow them to provide much needed services to hundreds of veterans and their families. Although the Legion Riders have been successful in supporting our veterans, the need is greater than we can provide alone.

We depend on the support of our local community, both citizens and businesses, in order to meet the needs of our homeless veterans and their families. Your donations of cash, merchandise, or services can help house, nour-


