Misters



'K-9 for Kayleigh' fundraisers go through the roof

Our first planning committee meeting for K-9 for Kayleigh started back in April. We had two representatives from each of the Legion entities.



We wanted this to be a family event with everyone coming together to help Kayleigh, one of our Jr Auxiliary Members. Kayleigh suffers from severe Intractable Epilepsy with numerous side effects and complications. She had just gotten approved by her

doctors for a service dog. The cost for a service dog and Kayleigh's continued care is tremendous. We set a date for June 20 for the event. During the time between our first meeting to June 20, we reached out to family and friends, Units and Posts. We had raised \$3,000 by the day of the event.

Before the event ever started we had pins made and sold. The day of the event we had raffles for blankets and a handmade tote bag, had Riders on bikes, cakes and cupcakes galore, a silent auction, BBQ cooking in the kitchen for a tasty meal and a 50/50 drawing. The room was cheerfully decorated with puppies and purple, Kayleigh's favorite color and the nationally recognized color for Epilepsy awareness. We had everything we needed to bring in more money for the much needed service dog and Kayleigh's additional expenses. The event lasted all day with people popping in from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. They came from out of town and the surrounding areas. At 9 p.m. we held the 50/50 and the winner donated the whole thing back to Kayleigh! Everyone was thrilled and on a high from the great day we had. That day alone we brought in \$6,000 so that gave us a total of \$9,000.

That's not where it stopped. One of our Riders, Herman Yentz offered a challenge: If I could raise another \$500, he would wear a poodle skirt to the Sock Hop the Auxiliary and SAL were hosting on July 18. The following day, I went to the Post to announce the challenge and more people started donating. That afternoon Herman knew he was had and challenged even more Riders. For every \$500, another Rider agreed to wear a skirt. This was all in support of Kayleigh. On July 18, we had 7 Legion Riders in poodle skirts. They were proud to be doing this.

Now this is what I call Family support. We all worked together, played together and raised a total of \$13, 349 together. We know that any extra money raised will be used to cover the many expenses the family has that insurance doesn't cover. Kayleigh's dog is in training. His name is Jack. They have met and seem to be a great match. This was a great act of support and kindness for an active duty family. Think of how much we can all do just by reaching out. Thank you to all who shared and supported American Legion Post 453's K-9 for Kayleigh!
