As this is my first newsletter article as your new post commander, let me share with you a little of my personal history.

# Meet our new Commander I enlisted in the US Air Force in

November 1968 and graduated from the US Army Signal School at Ft. Monmouth, NJ, in November 1969. After tech school I was assigned to the Armed Forces Network (formerly known as Armed Forces Radio and Television). My first duty assignment was to Wheelus Air Base in Libya, N. Africa. My tour in Libya was cut short due to Col. Muammar al-Gaddafi's successful coup.

From Libya, my next duty station was Incirlik Air Base, Turkey. My last Air Force duty station was the US Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs. On release from the Air Force in November 1972, I enlisted in the US Army Reserves and was assigned to the 108<sup>th</sup> Reserve Training Command. My military service ended in 1975.

In 2010, I retired from General Motors after 27 years as an emissions and fuel system engineer at the GM Proving Grounds in Michigan. I hold a B.Sc. IT degree from the University of Phoenix and did on-line graduate work at Carnegie Mellon University. A career opportunity for my wife Sheila, a Texas A&M Ph.D. alumna, brought us to Texas in 2010 where we purchased a home in Irving. I have been a member of the Masonic Fraternity for 42 years and received my 32 degree at the Dallas Scottish Rite Cathedral in 2013.

Prior to moving to Texas, I was a member of American Legion Post 141 in Howell, Mich., and the director of Post 141 Legion Riders. I've been the Director of the Love Field Post's Legion Riders since 2013, and post adjutant under Commander Charlie. I thank the members of Love Field Post 453 for giving me the honor of being commander of this great post for the 2015-2016 year.

#### Goals

Love Field Post 453 has a long history of providing support to our military families, our veterans, and our local community. I pledge my support to the American Legion family at Post 453 in meeting the needs of our veterans. I also realize that our post is in need of substantial repairs. Our building represents a valuable asset that needs to be maintained in order to ensure its value. With support from the members of Post 453, I will work to make the necessary repairs.

We need to realize that more of our younger veterans are seeking to join smoke-free posts. Without the influx of younger members, post membership will continue to decline and with it our ability to meet our primary mission — that of assisting our veterans. Love Field Post 453 needs to build its membership in order to maintain our position as the #I post in the 5th District.

Sons of the American Legion, or Legion Riders, belongs to the larger Love Field family. The actions of an individual member impact us all. Texas liquor laws prevent liquor from being carried off the post property. Doing so could result in large fines and the potential loss of our liquor license. In addition, any member found carrying liquor, beer, or wine off post grounds will lose canteen privileges for a period of time to be determined by the post's Executive Board. Please respect your fellow members and don't jeopardize the post's profitability by carrying liquor off premises.

#### **Gun Raffle**

The Legion looks to raise significant funds through our first gun raffle. The winning ticket takes both Henry lever action rifles; a 44 mag and a .17 HMR. Tickets are on sale now at the canteen or from selected legionnaires. Proceeds to help fund post repairs. We will be selling tickets at the Bass Pro Shop in Garland over several weekends beginning in September. Volunteers are needed to help staff our booth outside Bass Pro. Any help you can provide is greatly appreciated. A sign-up sheet is posted next to the kitchen door.

#### **Building Repairs**

Given the age of our building, there's always one or more re-

pairs that need doing. I will start a log sheet where members may record items in need of repair. Why create a log sheet? Members who unselfishly volunteer to make repairs are entitled to visit their post without being hounded about what latest problem needs fixing. Let's respect their personal time and allow them to enjoy an uninterrupted visit with friends. Record needed repairs on the posted log sheet. Emergency repairs, regardless of the time, should always be directed to your commander.

We have a number of post functions scheduled for July. Our Post Garage Sale and Car/Bike Wash will be held on July 18 beginning at 8 a.m. On July 25, the post will host an old time Sock Hop starting at 7 p.m. Flyers for these events are included with this newsletter.
